

#### The IHR

- One of the member Institutes of the School of Advanced Study (<u>www.sas.ac.uk</u>) part of the University of London.
- Founded in 1921 by the historian of Tudor politics, A. F. Pollard.
- Mission to promote and facilitate the study of history by providing institutional support and services.

#### **Our Collections**


- Published primary sources for the histories of Western Europe, European colonial empires and North and South America.
- There is a small general section in the library's general religious history collection under shelf mark ER.858 (Magic, Witchcraft and the response of the Church)
- Other works on magic and witchcraft can be found in the relevant geographic collection.



# Latin American, the Caribbean and the Southern US collections




- From the 16<sup>th</sup> century to the present day.
- Published primary sources complemented by reference works, periodicals and works on historiography.
- Strengths include the history of the colonial period in the Caribbean and Latin America and the colonial and Antebellum period in the US South.



## **Explicit Works**

- The library has several works specifically about witchcraft and magic in North and South America.
- Titles are added to the collections all the time.
- Recent acquisitions include:
  - Santería enthroned: art, ritual and innovation in an Afro-Cuban religion.
  - Voodoo: an African American religion
  - Tráfico de saberes: agencia femenina, hechicería e Inquisición en Cartegena de Indias (1610-1614)

# **Surveys of Indigenous Religions**




Hernado Ruiz de Alarcón. Tratato de las supersticiones y costumbres gentílicas

- Accounts written in the 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> centuries.
- Mainly covers Mexico and Central America and Peru.
- Surveys religious practices and how magic continued to be used in hunting, agriculture, fortunetelling, etc.




# **Finding Works in the Library**

- Example:
  - A subject search with the term 'Magic'
  - Produces 65 results.
  - One of these is: Magicians, South Carolina
  - This refers to the work, A documented history of Gullah Jack Pritchard and the Denmark Vesey slave insurrection of 1822.



#### **Church Sources**




- Bishops' and Archbishops' visitations.
- Published Inquisition records.
- Missionary writing; texts produced by the Jesuits were particularly numerous.






