About eighteen miles fouth-east from Aleppo, is a large plain, which we generally call the Valley of Salt, bounded with low, rocky hills, so as to form a kind of natural bason, which keep in the rains descending from them, together with the water derived from a few springs in the neighbourhood, and cause the whole to be entirely covered with water in the winter. The extent and evenness of the surface, however, prevents this water from collecting to any great depth; so that it is soon evaporated, and leaves a cake of salt in some places not less than half an inch thick, but it is more or less in proportion to the quantity of rain that salls in the winter; and with this crust the

#### CAUSES OF NATURAL PHENOMENA

Why does sea-water not provide trees with nourishment?

Is the reason the same as that for which it provides none for land-animals either, seeing that Plato, Anaxagoras, and Democritus<sup>b</sup> think that a plant is an animal fixed in the earth? The fact that sea-water is nutritious for, and can be imbibed by, marine plants as well as fishes, does not immediately imply that it is also good for the plants and trees that grow on dry land. For one thing it is too thick to make its way into their roots, and for another it is too heavy to rise <up their stems>. There are many proofs that it is heavy and earthy, in particular the fact that it holds up and supports boats and swimmers more than fresh water does.d

Or is it that trees are damaged above all by dryness, and seawater has a drying effect? (This effect explains why salt is a safeguard against putrefaction,

#### PREFACE

Again and again I hear leading men of our state condemning now the unfruitfulness of the soil, now the inclemency of the climate for some seasons past, as harmful to crops; and some I hear reconciling the aforesaid complaints, as if on well-founded reasoning, on the ground that, in their opinion, the soil was worn out and exhausted by the over-production of earlier days and can no longer furnish sustenance to mortals with its old-time benevolence. Such reasons, Publius Silvinus, I am convinced are 2 far from the truth; for it is a sin to suppose that Nature, endowed with perennial fertility by the creator of the universe, is affected with barrenness as though with some disease; and it is unbecoming to a man of good judgment to believe that Earth, to whose lot was assigned a divine and everlasting youth, and who is called the common mother


