








## **Testimony within Sources**






Before father went into the army, he was an interpreter in Arabia. His father was a horse-dealer. My father can speak eight or nine different languages fluently, besides a little of others...'




# Methodology and Historiography

  - Historical Portrayals in Literature, Film, Art, Music and Computer Games.












# Search Strategies and Resources

- Vary the types of search you do (e.g. keyword, subject, author, etc.)
- Consult bibliographies either in secondary works or stand-alone resources themselves such as the Bibliography of British and Irish History or a published or online bibliography on your research interest.
- Even articles about a subject can be incredibly useful, highlighting specific works, sections within unrelated works or useful library and archive collections...foot/endnotes are your friend!
- Search "broad" sources such as newspapers.


# The Huguenot Diaspora

- Doing either a keyword or subject search with the term 'Huguenot' will produce a list of results.














