BBIH is a database of over 660,000 references to:

- Local histories covering British and Irish history from 55 BCE to the present.
- Global histories covering Britain and Ireland's relations overseas including former British colonies and Commonwealth countries.
- Interdisciplinary and emerging areas within history such as the histories of migration, race and ethnicity, gender, sexual identity, social class, dis/ability, mental health, environmental history and the history of emotions.








BIBLIOGRAPHY OF BRITISH AND IRISH HISTORY

BBIH is update 3 times a year and includes bibliographic information on:

- Books.
- Journal articles and reviews from over 800 regularly searched journals.
- Chapters from collective volumes, including Festschriften and conference proceedings.
- History PhD these submitted late 1990s-present.

Total number of BBIH records (as of 20 March 2025)


