- Over 200,000 primary sources, guides, reference works and periodicals.
- From early medieval to contemporary.
- Print, electronic, microform collections.
- Collections strengths: Britain, Western Europe, Colonial history, the Americas, local and regional history.
- We work collaboratively with other libraries around Bloomsbury, especially Senate House Library, the other libraries within the School of Advanced Study.



Local History Collections in the IHR

- Some of the largest collections within the library.
- Includes collections on English, Irish, Scottish and Welsh local history, as well as a separate collection of London history.
- Strengths include:
 - Large holdings of local history society publications.
 - Directories and Poll Books
 - Publications of the Victoria County History
- There are also significant local history holdings in some of our other collections including France, Spain, Italy, Germany, the Low Countries and the United States.

 - Oral History Titles



 - Labouring Classes Dwellings Act and Sanitary Act (both 1866) are accessible within the library through UK Parliamentary Papers online.













Alan Johnson's memoirs and *Hearthlands* by Marianne Elliott





- The primary focus of other titles is to publish large excerpts or even whole interviews.








Personal Experiences: Online Oral History Projects




