# SAS Student ID Card


SAS students are issued with a student ID card on registration that enables use of the facilities and services at each of the libraries. These are linked to a library account. They allow entry, borrowing where available, renewal of loans, and access to Wi-Fi, as well as access to e-resources.

## Login

- In the libraries, click to connect to the e-resource - usually no login is required
- **Primary login- user ID number:** Provides full access to subscribed and purchased library content. From the catalogue and SAS websites click on the 'web access', 'remote access' or 'offsite access' links. When prompted, from your SAS student ID cards enter your family name as your User ID and enter the barcode number (normally 10 digits) as your password.
- **Additional login- Athens:** Directly from publisher websites use the login or institutional login option. Select *University of London: External System (ATHENS)* in the dropdown list, then *School of Advanced Studies students*. Login using your standard SAS email and password. The Athens login does not provide universal access to content on publisher websites. Please refer to library catalogues and websites to confirm availability of content.



## World Trials

### Database content

The World Trials Library is part of the HeinOnline database. It consists of digitised trial reports and court documents, together with commentary and biographies of famous lawyers. The collection ranges from ancient times (the trial of Socrates) up to the twentieth century. It includes series such as Howell's State Trials, American State Trials, Macdonnell's State Trials, Law Reports of Trials of War Criminals and Cox's Reports of Cases in Criminal Law.

### Access

Onsite access through the IALS account is available in IALS, SAS, SHL and University of London law departments.

Remote access is available to IALS and SAS staff, fellows and students, University of London law staff and students (including LLM students) via a current IALS Library card or SAScard. Remote access via Athens/Shibboleth is arranged by each University of London law department and ULIP for their registered law staff and students.

### Searching


Click on the Search tab to bring up the search facilities.

Field Search allows you to search by publication title and/or author; you can also search for key words and phrases, using the Text box. Select either the whole World Trials collection, or just one work. The search can be restricted to one or more sections of the data, e.g. table of cases, [table of] contents, index.

Advanced Search allows you to search by word or phrase. Select either the whole collection, or just one title. You can restrict your search to one or more sections of the data.
