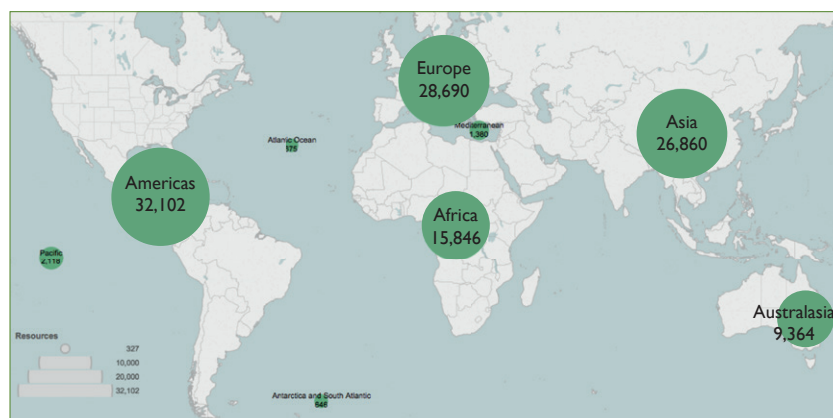

Global reach

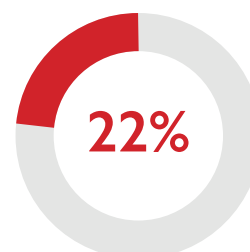

Foreign affairs



1. The BBIH has numerous search fields. The database automatically counts the number of hits for each individual search term and the total number of hits.
2. The search results can be ranked according to author, title, or year of publication. The database supports several export formats. Set up email alerts to stay up to date with new research.
3. The bibliographic records contain a wealth of details about publications on the subject. They also provide links to online catalogues to help you find the publications in research libraries in Britain and Ireland, and provide links to the full text where available.
